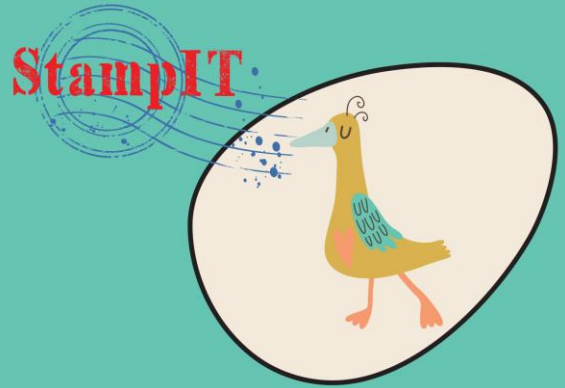


Pyrenean desman

Threats include water pollution and habitat loss.



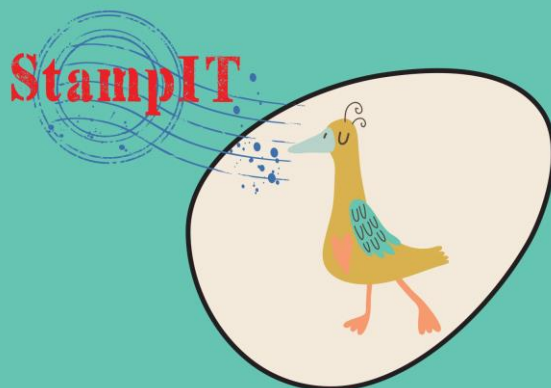
Species of dogs

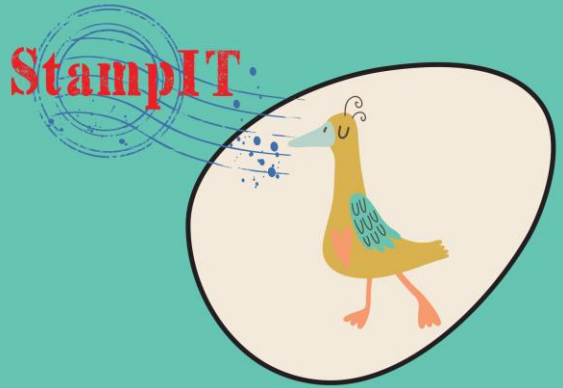

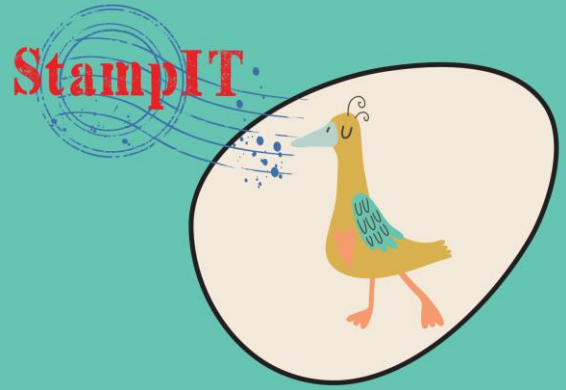


Egyptian mongoose

The Egyptian mongoose has a diet that includes birds, mammals, snakes, frogs, toads, insects, fish and crabs.

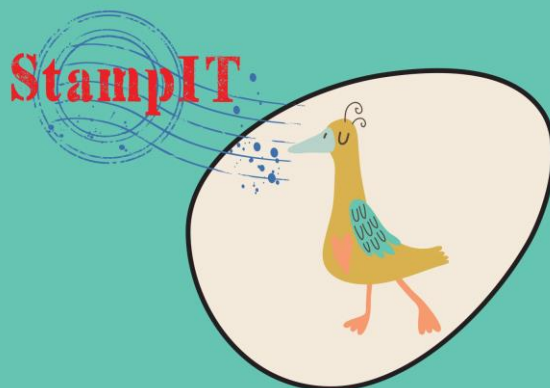
The mongoose lives in pairs or in family groups.

The Egyptian mongoose can be found in Egypt, Morocco, Libya, Israel, Palestine, most of sub-Saharan Africa, Spain and Portugal. It is thought that this mongoose was introduced to Spain and Portugal during the Arab occupation around 711AD to 1492AD.

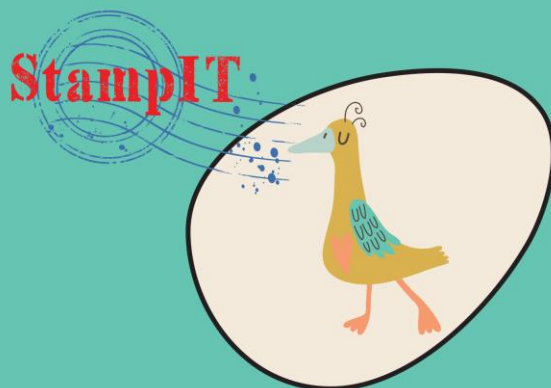

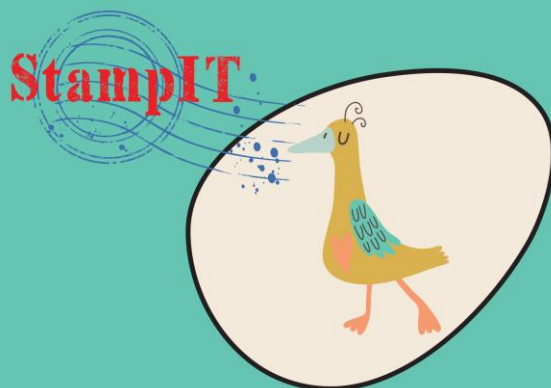


Chamois

The chamois is adapted to cold, mountain habitat.

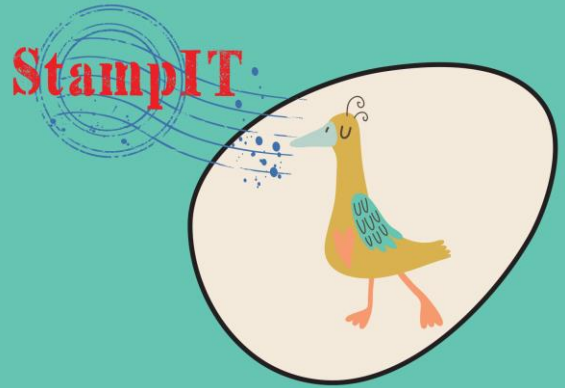
They live in herds of between 15 and 30 individuals.

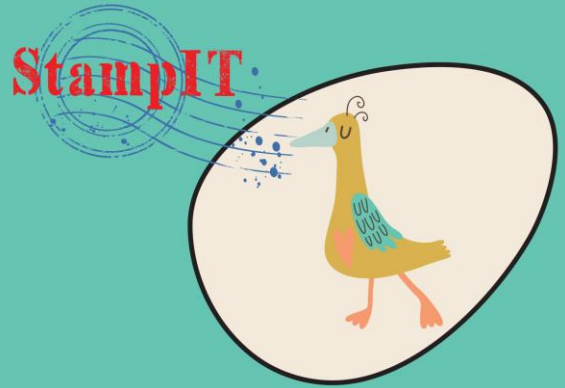
Starfish

There are about 1,500 species of starfish in the world.

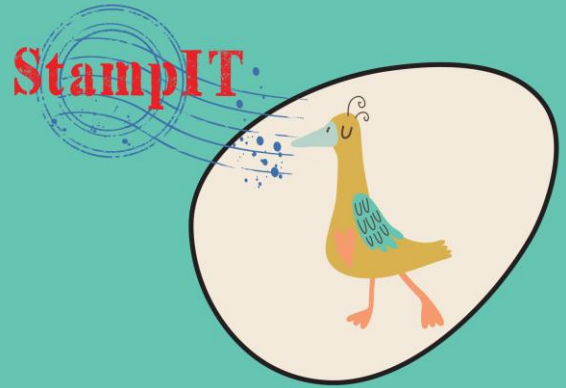
*echinoderms are marine invertebrates.

Aragonite is one of the two most common, naturally occurring, crystal forms of calcium carbonate. The other is calcite.

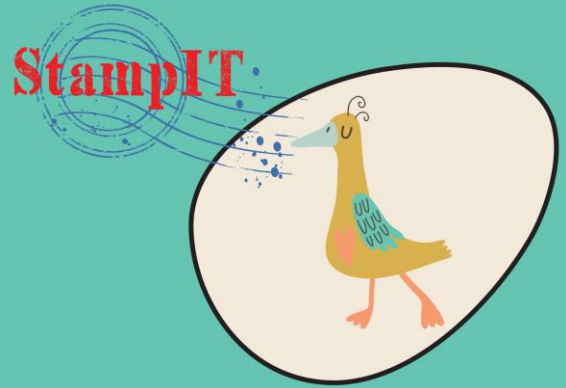
Aragonite is used in jewellery, ornaments and cement and steel production.

They are huge limestone cliffs. They were given their name because they look like large organ pipes.

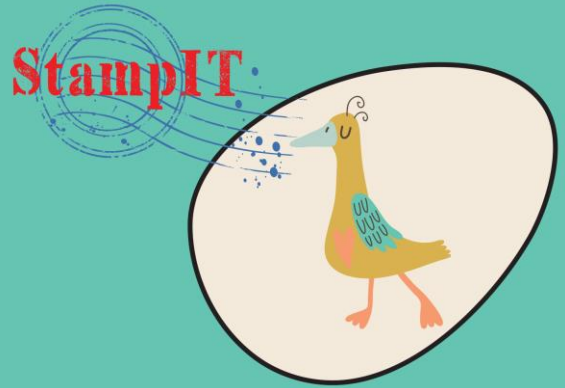

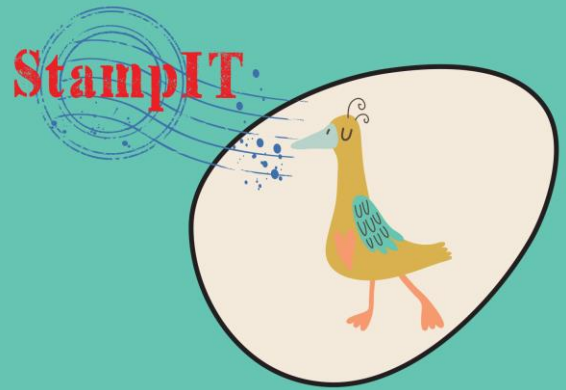


Currency

The currency of Spain since 2002 is the Euro.

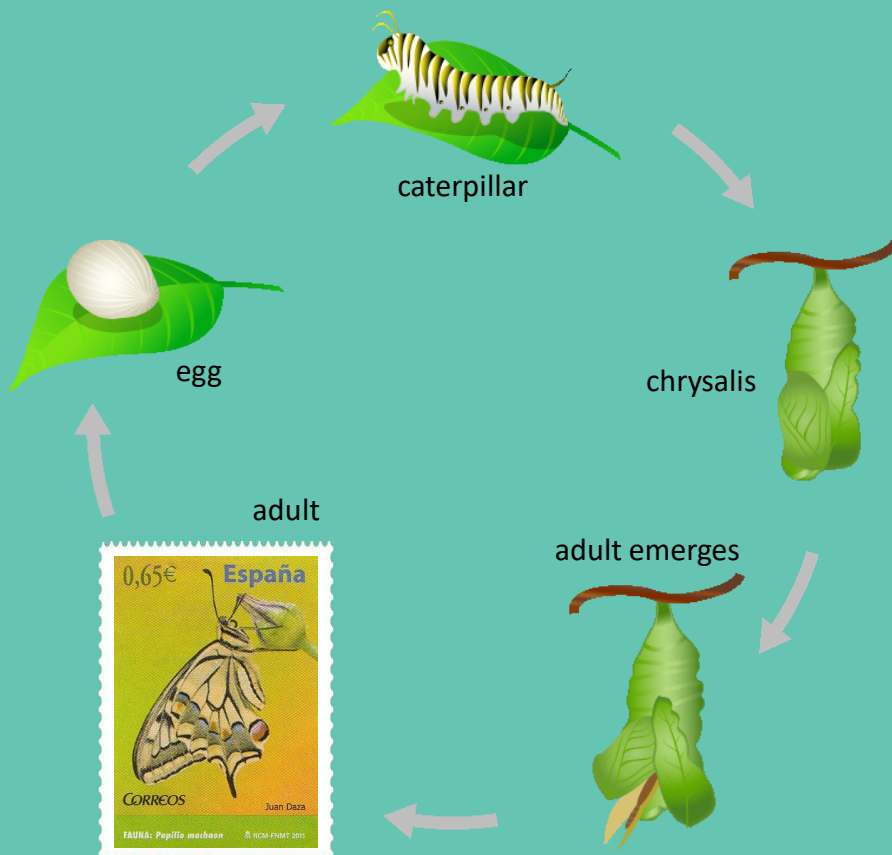
Before 2002, the Spanish currency was the Peseta.

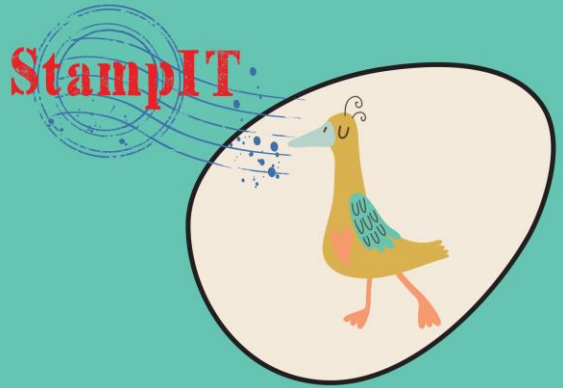
Some of the stamps show the value in PTAS which is short for Peseta.

The larvae of the butterfly is the caterpillar.



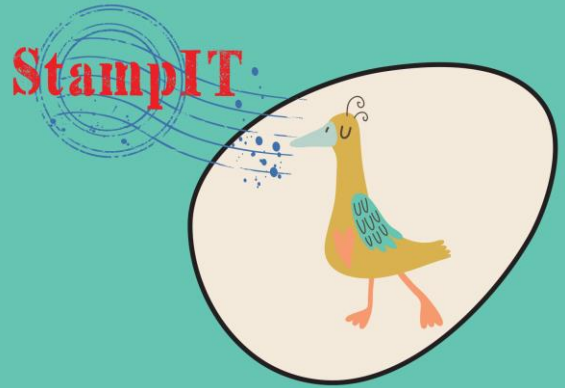

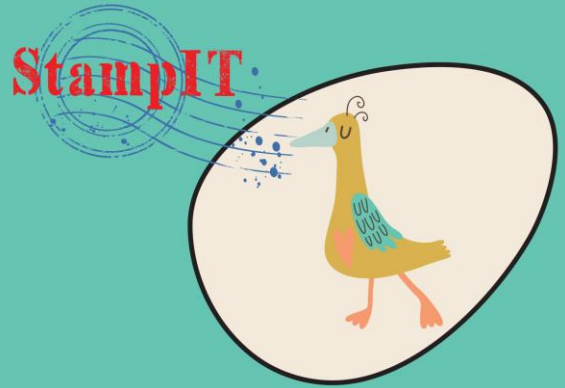

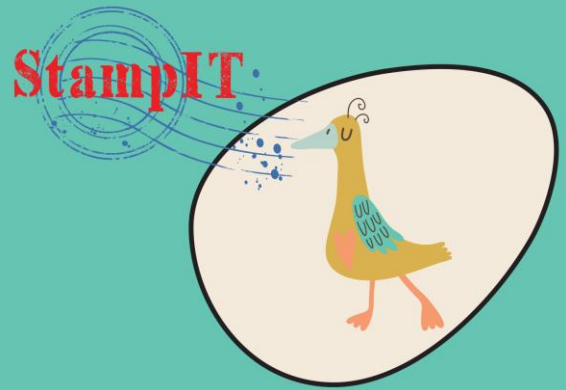
Genets

The common genet has a rather large head, rounded ears, brown eyes with whitish patches beneath them. Like a cat, the genet has retractable claws.*

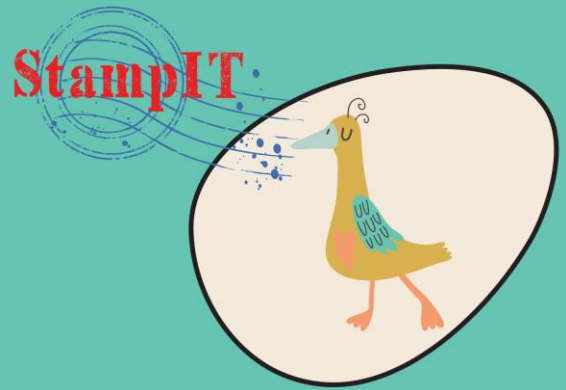
They feed on small mammals and birds.

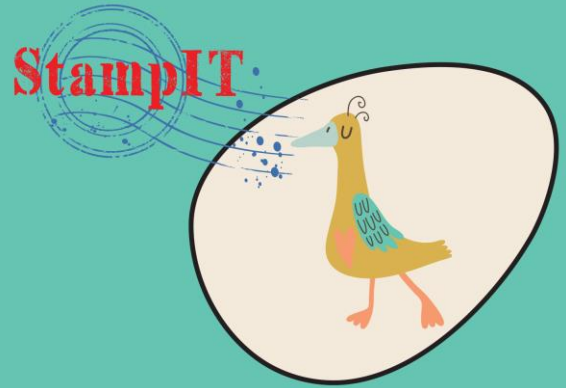


Salamanders

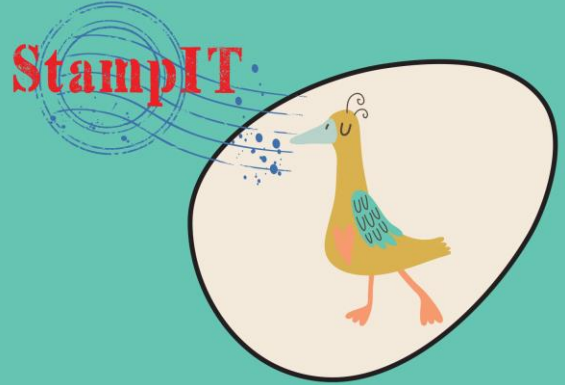

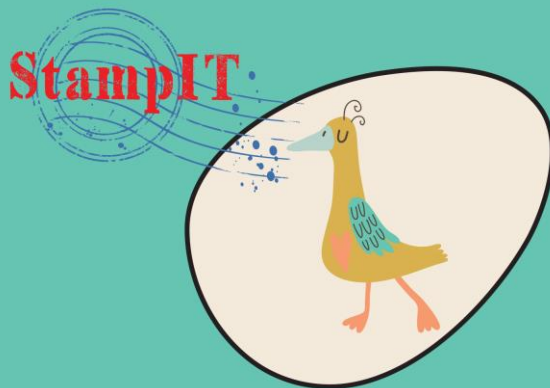


Eastern imperial eagle

The main threat is habitat loss. They are also often shot or poisoned and can be electrocuted on power lines.

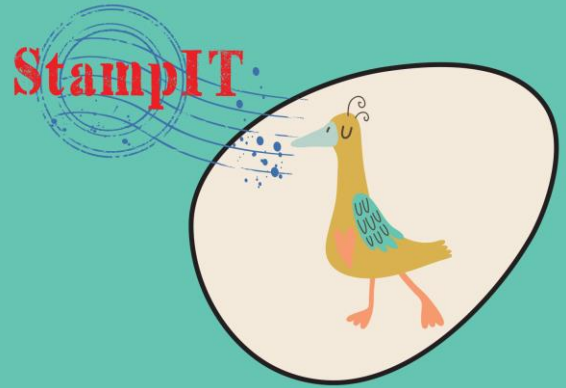

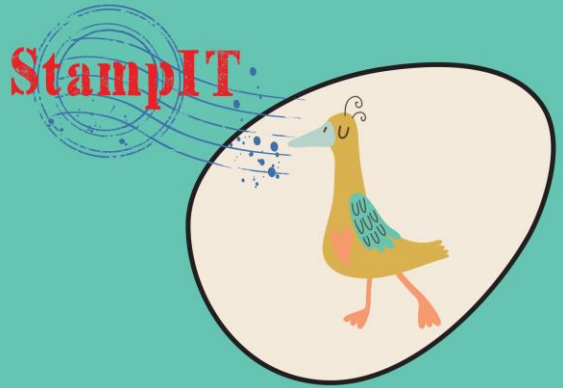

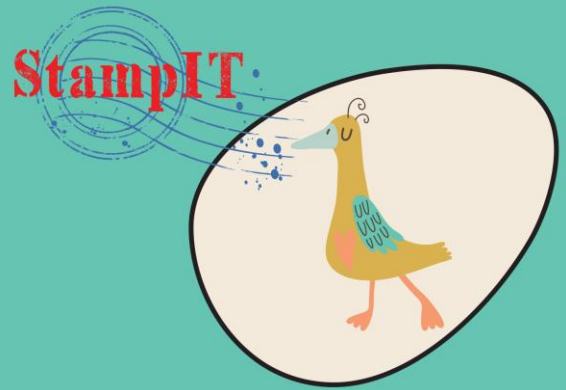


Iberian grey wolf

However the Iberian population is near threatened because of habitat loss and the lack of a management plan.

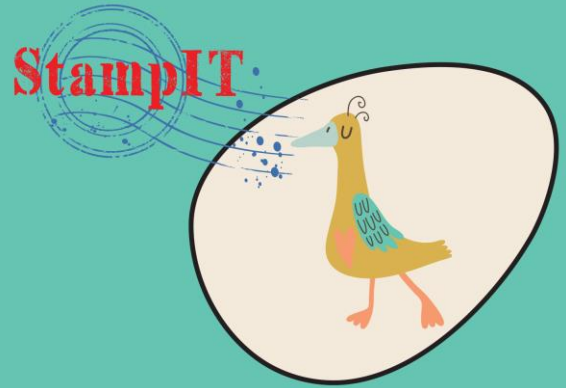
There is also a small population in Sierra Morena which is far from the main population in the north and this population is classed as critically endangered.



Football

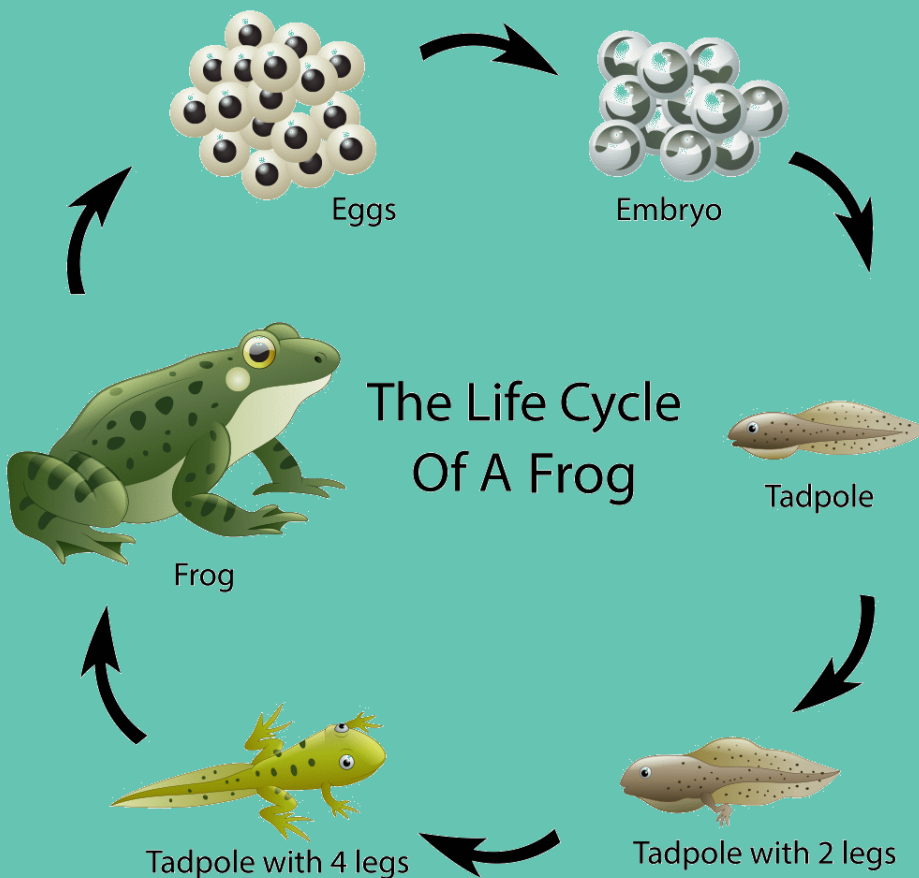
Spain is one of eight countries to ever have won the FIFA World Cup. It did so in 2010.*

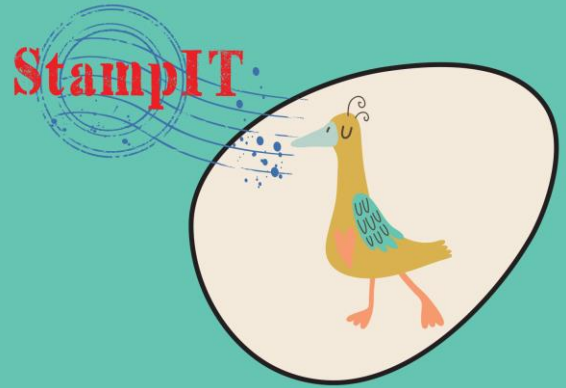

Young frogs are called tadpoles which is el renacuajo in Spanish.



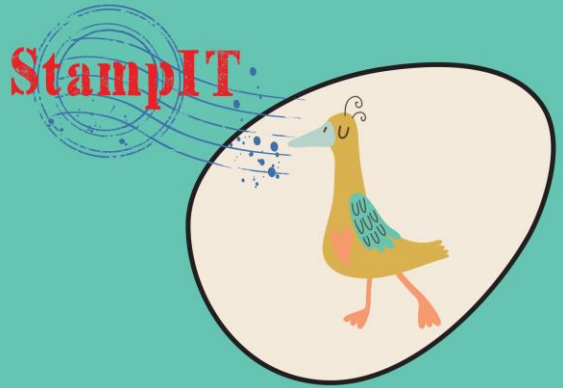
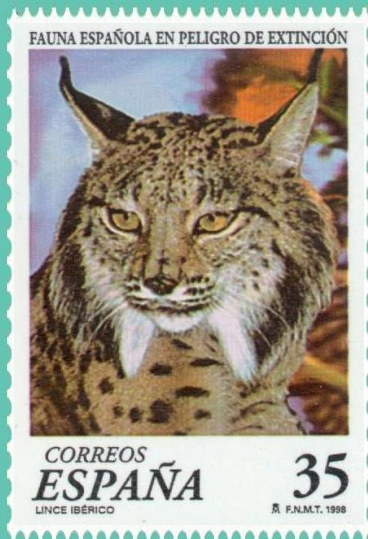


Bridges

There is an amazing footbridge above the Manzanares river in the Arganzuela park, Madrid.



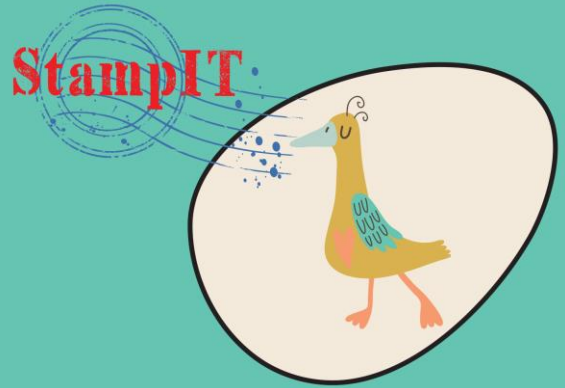


Iberian lynx

The world's most threatened species of cat is the Iberian lynx.

Historically widespread throughout Spain, Portugal and France, there are now only two isolated breeding populations left in south western Spain.

There is now a successful conservation breeding programme and there has been some reintroductions to the wild.

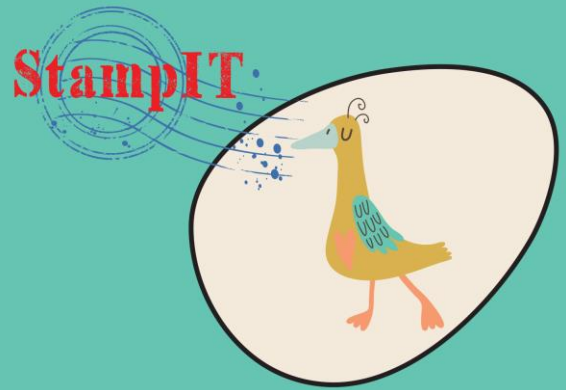

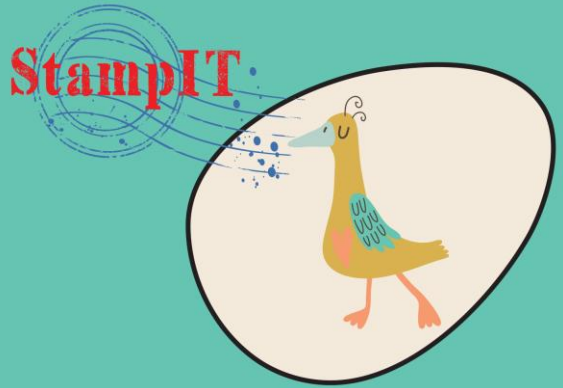

Scorpions

The most common scorpion in Spain is the Mediterranean scorpion. The sting is painful but only mild compared to the sting of its relative in Africa, which can be fatal.

The European black spider is also present in Spain. It is found in more northern and wetter areas. Its sting short lived.
