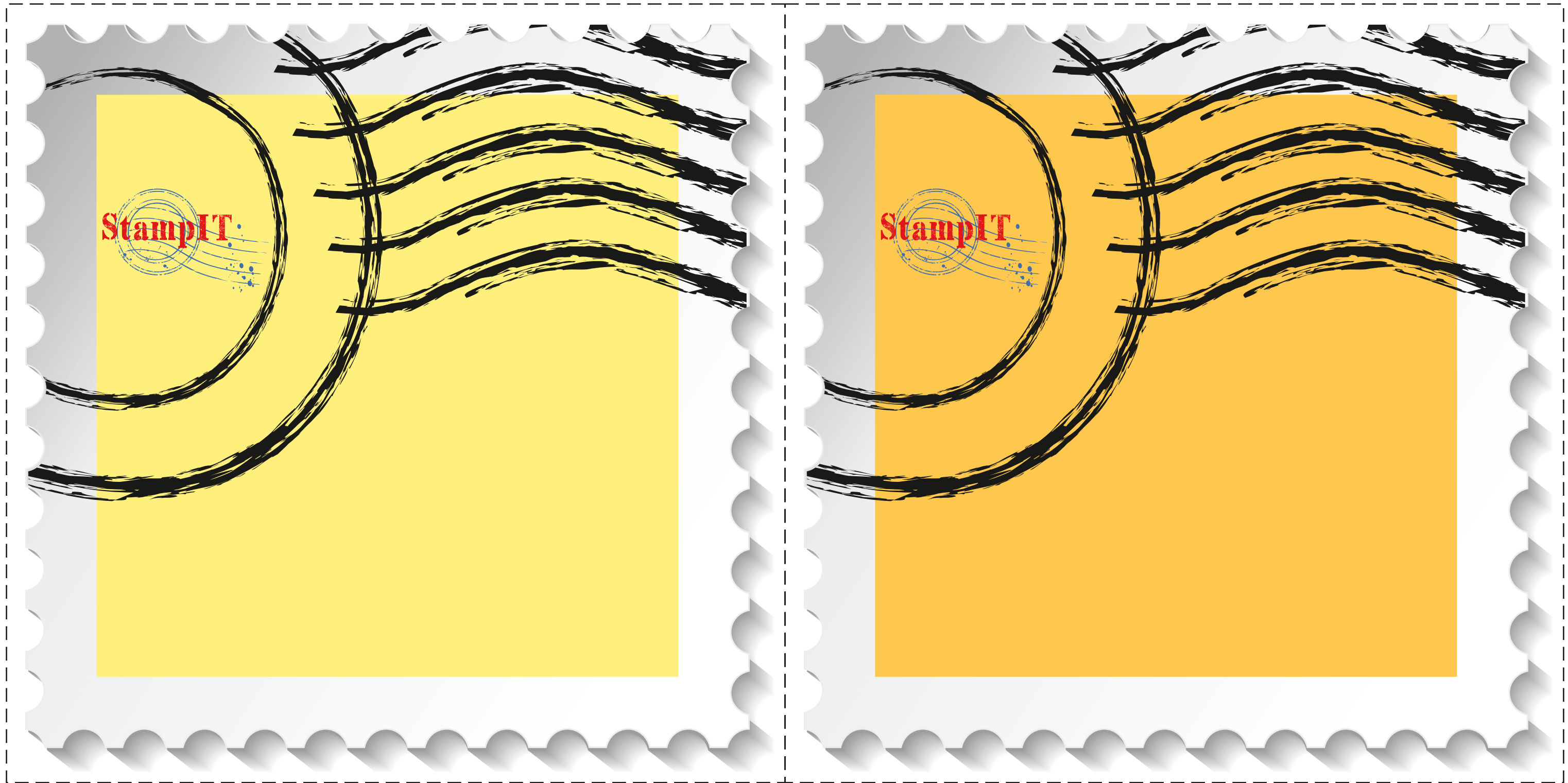




Challenges

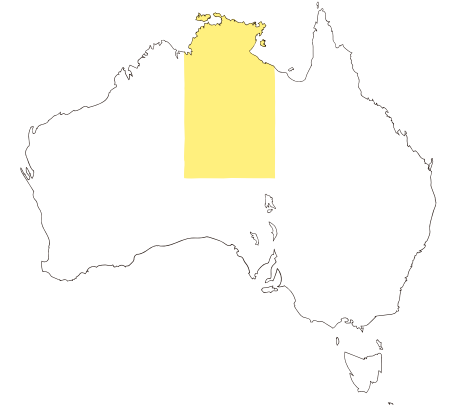

1. Find out the name of this state or territory.

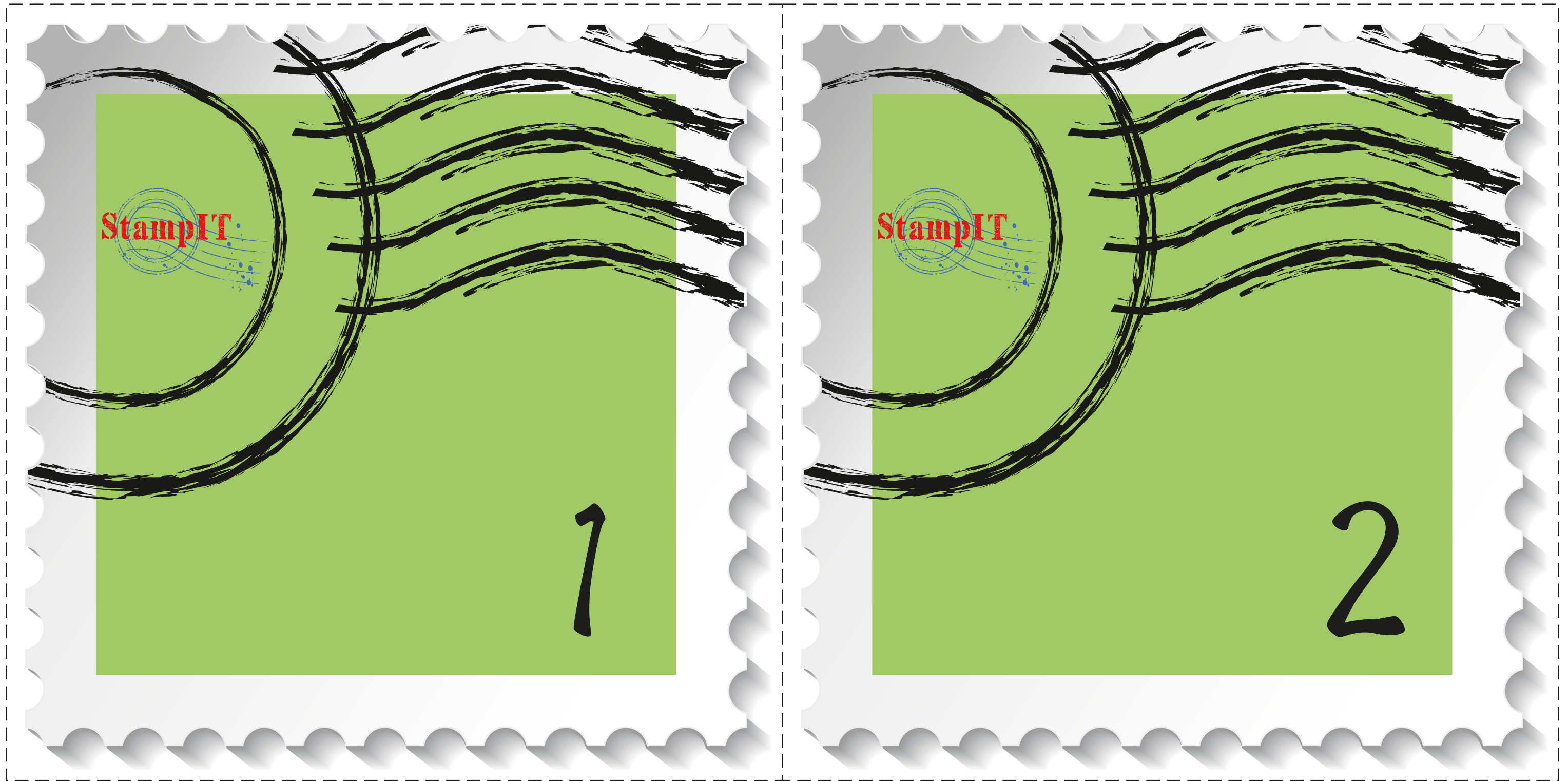


2. This stamp of the red kangaroo was issued in 1986 and is from a set called 'Australian Wildlife'. **What size is a new-born kangaroo?**

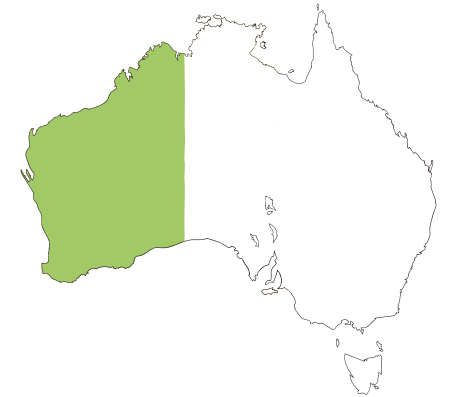

This stamp of the western swamp tortoise was issued in 2016 and is from a set called 'Endangered Wildlife'. The words 'Critically Endangered' are written on the stamp. **What does Critically Endangered mean?**

This stamp of the magnificent tree frog was issued in 1999 and is from a set called 'Small Pond Life'. **What is the difference between the toes on a tree frog and a ground frog?**

4.



This stamp of the red-capped parrot was issued in 2005 and is from a set called 'Australian Parrots'. There are 56 species of parrot found in Australia. **Name at least 5 other species of Australian parrots.**
Note: The 56 species includes cockatoos, lorikeets, rosellas, ringnecks and budgies.

This stamp of the Bathurst copper butterfly was issued in 2020 and is from a set called 'Wildlife Recovery'. A butterfly is an invertebrate.

This stamp of the wombat was issued in 2019 and is from a set called 'Australian Fauna'. Wombats are mainly crepuscular and nocturnal.

What do crepuscular and nocturnal mean?

This stamp of the koala was issued in 2020 and is from a set called 'Wildlife Recovery'. Koalas have two opposable thumbs on their front paws.

What is meant by opposable thumbs?

Why is this bird called the laughing kookaburra?

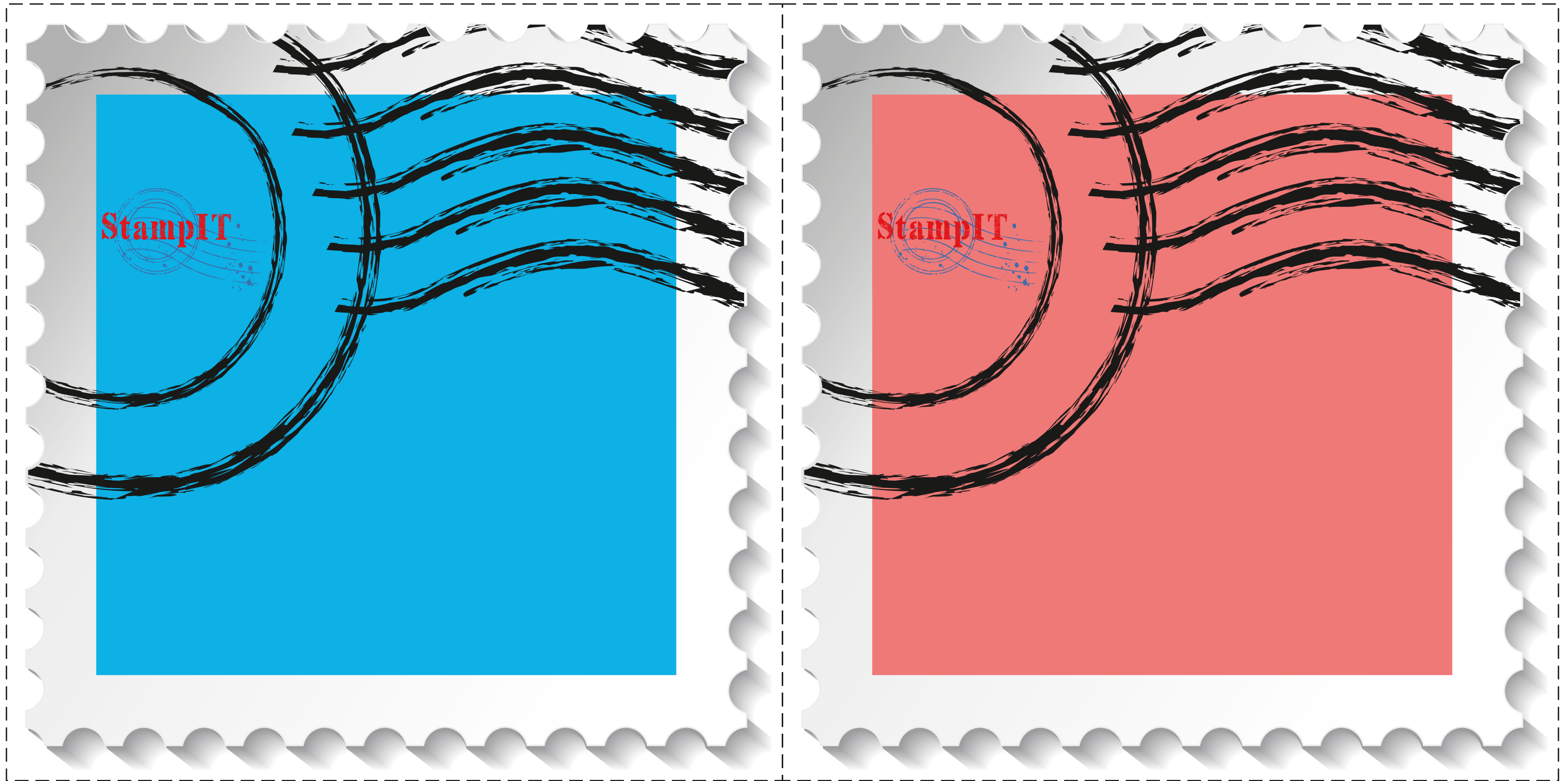
3. The set of stamps is called 'Bush Wildlife'.
